The Importance of Goal Setting

Goal setting is an important task in Ulife. It gives people purpose and accountability, and achieving a goal can boost a person's self-confidence and sense of pride. For students with academic challenges and disabilities, goal setting has even more significance.

For a student struggling to achieve age-appropriate academic skills, school and life can be overwhelming. For many students, negative secondary symptoms of dyslexia include low self esteem, anxiety, and "susceptibility to self-criticism." Subsequently, the dyslexic brain tends to think "whole picture," and struggles with the steps it needs to get to a final product.

Teaching students to chunk ideas and set goals will help negate these negative emotions and assist individuals to experience and explore success and triumphs.


